

Fly-Outs: The Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, Cleveland, OH (KBKL) - 15 July 2023



We may have had to cancel the planned sightseeing flight around Manhattan three times in late June and early July, but the weather finally parted long enough for eight people in three airplanes to visit the <u>Rock & Roll Hall</u> of Fame on 15 July 2023 in Cleveland, OH.

It was the WFC's first return to the Rock Hall since June 2016. Participants included Nicole Bartell, Gilead Biggie, and Ed Ciolkowski in Ed's Archer II, Ziad Safadi with Chris and Kristy Houston in Chris' Warrior II, and Brad Roehrig and Nikki in Brad's Cirrus. The group spent roughly three hours exploring the museum before a 1:00 lunch reservation at <u>Nuevo Modern Mexican and Tequila Bar</u>. The views of the city when flying into Burke Lakefront are always spectacular, the museum interesting, and lunch was excellent (the West Coast Shrimp tacos were especially popular). Fly-Outs: Tangier Island (KTGI) and First Flight (KFFA) - 30 Jul 2023 to 1 Aug 2023

At the beginning of the 2023 flying season, the WFC Activities Committee set a stretch-goal of a pilgrimage to First Flight Airport (KFFA) and the Wright Brothers National Memorial that would include visits to Tangier Island (KTGI) and some of the more remote airfields on Hatteras and Ocracoke Islands.

Dan Probst from the Activities Committee meticulously planned this journey to span three days with two overnight stays in Kill Devil Hills, NC. Participants included Dan Probst flying N701DT, Gilead Biggie with Scott and Kim Lasky in N1185X, Ed Ciolkowski in his Archer II, and Chris Houston with Tom Carter in Chris' Warrior II. The group was also joined for dinner and for a day of island hopping by WFC board member Dave Perricone who was vacationing in the Outer Banks at the time.

On Day 1, the group was wheels up at 8:00 am. Owing to a tailwind, the aircraft reached Tangier Island Airport (KTGI) after a mere 2.5 hours of time in the air. Tangier Island is a small, remote island located in the middle of Chesapeake Bay. It is home to roughly 400 year-round residents who speak with a unique dialect as a result the island's isolation. Sadly, the island is shrinking, continuing a decades long loss of landmass as due to erosion and rising seas. Experts believe the town may need to be abandoned in a few short decades. Lunch was at Four Brothers Crabhouse. Afterward, the group toured the island by golf cart.

From Tangier, the four aircraft



was excellent for flying. Dan chose

the dates well!











After four total hours of flying, everyone landed on hallowed ground, runway 3 at First Flight Airport. They touched down within feet of *(Continued on page 5)*

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where the Wright Brothers made history with their first four successful powered, controllable flights on 17 December 1903.

First Flight Airport lacks a parallel taxiway, so all four aircraft accumulated in a jug handle loop at the approach end of runway 21 until a break in traffic allowed them to back taxi as a convoy to the ramp.

It is hard to miss the large dune where the Wrights conducted their early glider experiments nor the massive Art Deco granite pylon placed atop it to commemorate their feats. After arrival, the group visited the monument, the markers showing where each tenuous flight











in the 1903 Flyer landed, and the on-site museum. Dinner was at the Outer Banks Brewing Station.

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
kowski – the group explored south and west along the barrier islands, landing at Billy Mitchel Airport (KHSE) on Hatteras Island and Ocracoke Airport (W95) on Ocracoke Island. Both airports are immediately adjacent to the beach. On Ocracoke, they encountered a pair of turboprop-equipped T-34 Mentors with callsigns Devil 1 and Devil 2 out of NAS Oceana. Lunch was at Howard's Pub on Ocracoke. Back in Kill Devil Hills that evening, some of the group opted for pizza while others enjoyed Mexican at 3 Tequilas. The day was concluded at the beach.

After launching from First Flight on Day 3, the group stopped for a late breakfast at the Pilot House Inn on Hummel Airport (W75) in Virginia before proceeding home.

Over three days and roughly 12 hours of flying, the group paid tribute to the Wright Brothers, landed at seven different airports, enjoyed plenty of a seafood, and took in the amazing vistas that the Outer Banks have to offer. There is no other place quite like it.
